Fourth of July is coming up quick. See page three on how we will celebrate Independence Day here at Triumph Sheets / TVC, along with some potential trivia questions.



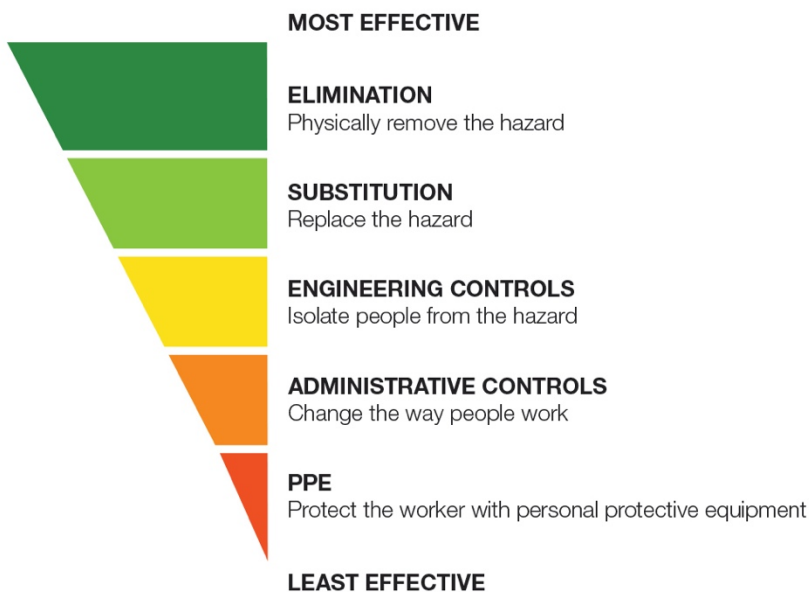

We look forward to seeing the creative outfits you come up with! Trivia will run throughout the week, place your answers in the box located on the decorated table in each breakroom.

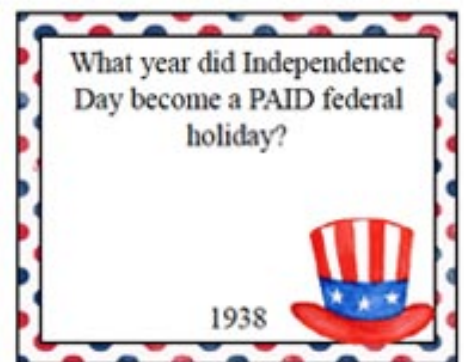
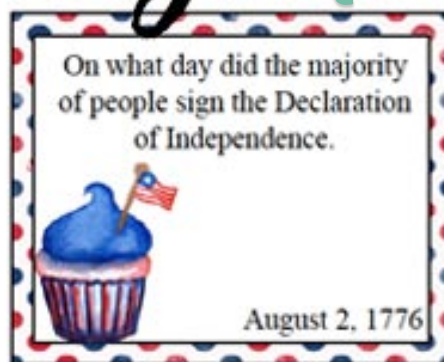
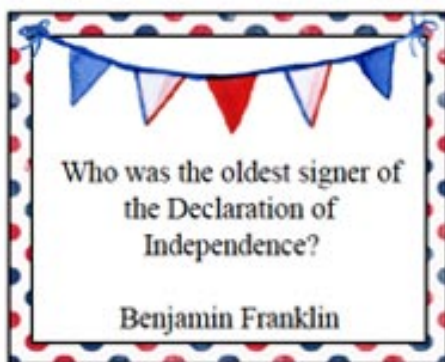
