It was pretty comfortable from the start, my safety manager did a great job of explaining everything.

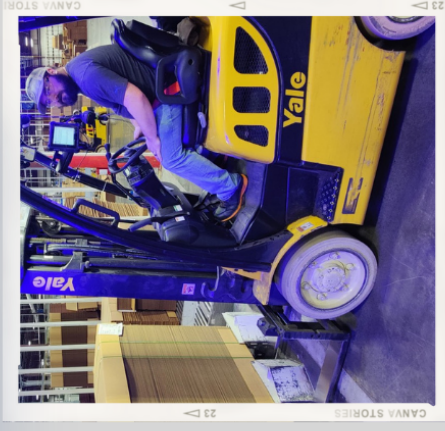
What is your reason for working safely?
